## New crisis looms on Ethiopian border

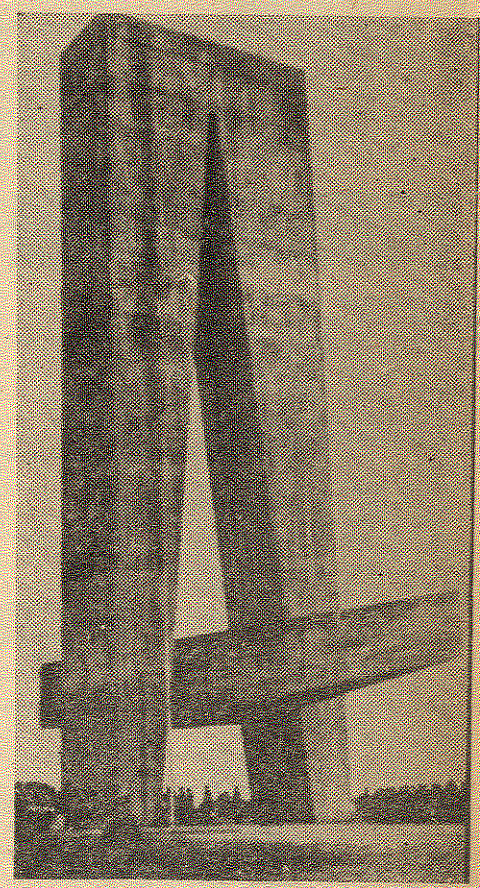
**Khartoum, Sudan**  
THE Sudanese government yesterday announced it was dispatching troops to the Sudan-Ethiopian border in response to the "aggressive" massing of Ethiopian forces in the disputed frontier zone.

An Official communiqué said troops have already left for the border region near Pashala, between the Atbara and Steit rivers, after incidents with Ethiopian soldiers.

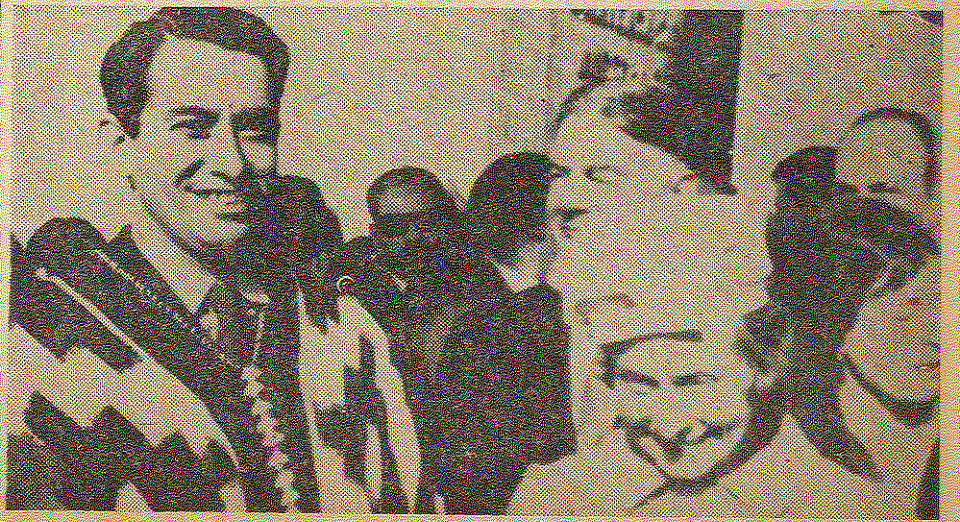
Political observers here believe the Ethiopian attitude is connected with the Middle East crisis and claim that Israeli influence in Ethiopia is strong.

Emperor Haile Selassie's Christian nation has never been particularly friendly towards its Arab neighbours, though Sudan and Ethiopia recently reached an agreement forbidding farmers to till any land belonging to the other nation — before the signing of the accord farmers used to cross the border freely in search for workable soil.

The accord however, was criticized as being confusing as the demarcatory lines were not clearly established. (UP)
